Christine – thank you for the very beautiful monthly Newsletters and the preparation of birthday and Mass cards for the Community.



## MARIAN FALLON'S DEFINITIVE PROMISE AT CARMEL MONASTERY Homily by Fr Rick Loughnan (Sunday 3 July 2022)

"For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring forth before all the nations." (Isaiah 61:11)

The Garden of Carmel – The life of Christ lived in the Holy Spirit - Carmel is a microcosm of the Body of Christ. A place of blessings - a place of God's grace and the Community's response - a call, in the Body of Christ, to contemplation and prayer. You, Marian, do and will continue, with this deep commitment and promise, to live this life of Carmel, this vocation, in the funny, busy, good and sinful world we live in, not in the monastery, but in your own setting and life and world. All the riches of the Lord, the Sacraments, the Prayer of the Church, the strong association with the Sisters and the monastery... the riches of the Lord's garden will remain yours but your Carmelite life will have its own difficulties as I am sure you know already. How do you continue to allow this life, this call, to take deeper and deeper root in your life, in all the ordinariness and challenges of your family and circumstances?

The big answer of course is in the Gospel today – this famous passage where Jesus talks of what we call the Beatitudes. These are not so much things we should do. They are more what our lives will look like as we follow our Saviour, as we walk in his love.

So, Lord, how do we show these fruits, these flowers from your garden? How do we grow in holiness, how do we become love as you are love?

Well, I think the psalm and the second reading really help us here.

First, let's remind ourselves with great confidence and joy – the Lord is our Shepherd. The Good Shepherd. The Lord is leading us. He is for us. He is the Shepherd; he is GOOD. This is where we start.

Secondly, with his leading, his grace, his soil, his planting, nurturing and the watering he has done, and will do, our task is simply to continue to respond. Here again is what St Paul writes to his beloved Philippian converts. Is there any better way of saying it?

"So, if there is any encouragement in Christ, any incentive of love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfishness or conceit, but in humility count others better than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others." (Phil. 2:1-4)

This is the way of holiness; this is the secret of growth in the Holy Spirit. You, Marian, you, dear Sisters, and all of us here, let us plunge in again to the little way, the way that is sometimes painful, that necessarily includes the Cross of our Shepherd, and let us set our sights on him who loves us so much.

We thank God that you have heard the call of the Lord, Marian, and will make these final promises today. May the Lord richly bless you.



NATIONAL STATUTES PART VII – Organisation and Government Section Fourteen – Elections

"O guide our minds with thy blest light, with love our hearts inflame."

47. Without prejudice to [45], in elections a candidate must receive more than half the valid votes to be elected, that is a simple majority. If there is no such majority in the first ballot a second ballot is held. If even in the second ballot no candidate receives a simple majority, a third is held in which only the two with the highest number of votes in the second ballot are candidates. These two candidates do not vote in this ballot. In this third ballot the one with the majority of votes is elected. In all elections where two or more receive an equal number of votes the senior by First Promise is elected, and if they made Promises on the same day, the senior by age is elected.

48. All members in Promises who are active in community have the right to vote in elections. However, because of the essentially lay character of the Order, members who are clerics may not be elected or appointed to office. Special or Isolated members may not vote in elections or be elected to office.

49. The Spiritual Assistant presides at elections with the President and Secretary as scrutineers. If the Spiritual Assistant is absent, the President presides with the Director of Formation and the Secretary as scrutineers.
