What a gift a call to Carmel is. I think my mainstays are:

"Prayer is a conversation with the One whom we know loves us." (St Teresa of Jesus)

To me, the singular focus of the Carmelite charism and the call to Community are priceless. No matter how complicated or busy life becomes, there is the blessing of Retreat into your "heart-room" with God.

The call to Community is so gentle and fulfilling. To consciously be able to totally throw yourself into the providence and loving will of the Holy Spirit is mind-blowing! I think this manifests itself especially in the times of our Community elections.

Unlike the elections in a country etc, where candidates put themselves forward to be elected, our Canonical elections encompass all of our members, allowing the Holy Spirit to do His work.

This freaked me out at first, but then I came to know that service is a very important part of Community life, and that if the Holy Spirit gives you a job to do in, and for the Community, He gives you everything needed and more, to fulfil it.

I remember when I was elected President and very nervous, I was giving Fr Jolliffe, SM (our Spiritual Assistant at the time) a ride home from our meeting, I told him how nervous I was and that I did not feel worthy. He laughed and said, "Who said you had to be worthy?" That really put it in perspective for me. I just had to be willing to serve.

So, they have been 39 happy and blessed years since I first presented myself to Carmel. It has been a grace to see our Community grow and to become Canonically erected, and to contribute to the writing of our Statutes for our Constitutions after their acceptance 20 years ago. To have been able to serve as Councillor, President and Formator, and National Convenor and Treasurer has been a privilege and I thank you all, my dear ChCh Peace of Christ Community, for trusting me.



PRE-FORMATION

Enquirers attend Bethany Day if possible and/or monthly Community Meetings, joining the Community at the Spiritual Adviser's talk, followed by Evening Prayer in the Chapel, thence afternoon tea.

A time of 6 months is the recommended time so they can become familiar with Community members. This also gives the Formator and Council time to discern the suitability of the Enquirer to progress to formal formation in the Secular Order of Our Lady of Mount Carmel and St Teresa of Jesus.

Before moving onto formal formation, i.e., First Promise Formation, the Enquirer is prepared for this important step by guidance in the daily life of a Secular Carmelite, i.e., praying the Divine Office and familiarising themselves with the 6M's, plus reading of the Aspirancy formation guide.

After discernment by Enquirer, Formator and Council, an Enquirer can make a formal request of the Council to progress to the next stage (First Promise) by writing a letter stating why they wish to progress.
